

***Fahrenheit 451* Project Options**

Directions: Choose ONE of the following choices to complete for the novel. The written component can be typed or neatly written in blue or black ink. Artwork should not be done on notebook paper. Your project will be graded on creativity, accuracy, neatness and thoroughness. **You should cite evidence from the book!** Worth 50 points. Due Friday, December 14.

A) Montag, Mildred, and Beatty all seem to have double personalities. Choose one and draw a picture showing the two faces of the character. Add an appropriate quotation from the novel to show each side. Write a one-page paper explaining the artistic techniques used to communicate the character's personality traits.

B) Create a short graphic novel indicating major parts of the novel. Please have at least 10 frames that show the action from the story in a concise form.

C) Create a replica / diorama of an important scene from the book using details from the story. Write a one-page paper explaining the significance of this scene and its relationship to the theme of the novel.

D) Create a word and/or picture collage representing the entire novel (main characters, major events, turning points, etc.). This must be done on a large sheet of drawing paper or poster board (8.5" x 11" paper is too small). This must be accompanied by a one-page written explanation of why you selected the certain words and/or pictures.

E) Make your own soundtrack for *Fahrenheit 451*. Type a list of at least 10 song titles, along with the artists, where the song fits into the book (page number required), and explain the action occurring when the song would be playing. Create a CD jacket/Cover Art (Yes, I know CDs are old school) that illustrates the book. This should be in color. Along with the list, explain your reasoning for choosing each song.

F) Create a 3D mobile made of at least **four** significant objects / symbols in the novel. Write a 1-2 page paper explaining how each object is important / used in the novel and its relationship to the themes in the novel.

G) Have a better idea? See Dr. Biggs for approval.
